

COVID TRAVEL CONDITIONS

Croatia

Valid April 01 – April 15

1. Traveling to Croatia from an EU / EEA Member State and Schengen area (regardless of citizenship)

a. Traveling from Green-listed countries/regions

- No restrictions, if person is not showing symptoms of the disease and had no close contact

b. Traveling from CDC Green-listed countries/regions, but transiting through other states/regions

- No restrictions, if they do not show symptoms of the disease and were not in close contact with the patient and PROVIDED passengers can show proof that they have not stayed in the transit region/countries

c. Traveling from CDC countries/regions that are NOT on the Green list:

- Conditions apply, see below

2. Citizens of EU / EEA Member States (and members of their families) traveling to Croatia from third countries

- Conditions apply, see below

3. Citizens of third countries traveling to Croatia

- Must present business invitation letter
- Must fill out the Enter Croatia online form <https://entercroatia.mup.hr/>
- Conditions apply, see below

4. Citizens of countries to which special epidemiological measures apply

- Must present a negative PCR test result not older than 48 hours
- Mandatory 14-day self-isolation applies
- Self-isolation can be shortened in case of a negative result from a PCR conducted no earlier than 7 days after entering the country

CONDITIONS FOR PASSENGERS TRAVELING TO CROATIA APPLIES TO CATEGORIES 1C, 2 & 3

1. Entering with proof:

No quarantine will be prescribed if one of the following proofs are presented at border crossing:

- Negative PCR test not older than 48 hours*
- Rapid antigen test - BAT not older than 48 hours*
- Vaccination certificate, conditioned on:
 - 2-dose vaccinations: Evidence that the second dose was received more than 14 days prior to border crossing
 - Single dose vaccinations: Evidence that the single dose was received more than 14 days prior to border crossing
- Certificate confirming that the passenger has recovered from SARS-COV-2, conditioned on:
 - Positive PCR or rapid antigen test conducted dated between no earlier than 11 days and no longer than 180 days before the border crossing, or;
 - Doctor's certificate that they have recovered from SARS-COV-2

2. Entering without proof:

- PCR or Rapid antigen test required immediately upon entering Croatia, with obligatory quarantine until a negative test result
- Passenger must report test result back to their specific border crossing
- 10 day quarantine if no test is conducted

3. Obligatory re-testing upon entering

- If entering with a rapid antigen tests or for stays longer than 10 days, a retest is required within 10 days of the test presented at the border;
